Houston LGBTQ+ Political Caucus PAC Endorses in 2022 General Election

HOUSTON, TX (August 13, 2022) – The membership of the Houston LGBTQ+ Political Caucus voted to endorse eighty-five candidates for the 2022 General Election. With over 150 members present, the meeting lasted just over two hours making it the shortest, virtual endorsement meeting The Caucus has ever had.

By a vote of 71 to 41, the membership voted to accept the recommendations of the Screening Committee in eighty-four races, leaving only five races to the will of the body. Thirty-seven voting members abstained from that vote. Ultimately, the membership voted not to make endorsements in four races. The candidates endorsed are as follows:
